**Meeting Minutes**

**1. Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am. The following members were in attendance: Joyce Lew, Susan Riehl, Ann Hargett, Ada Anderson, Judy Hall, Erica Cole, and Kristen Knoll. Cheryl Cobler was in attendance as the new City liaison.

**2. Approval of the September 19, 2016 Meeting Minutes**

Ann Hargett moved and Susan Riehl seconded to approve the September 19, 2016 meeting minutes. The motion passed unanimously by those members present.

**3. December Luncheon Update**
